FINDING TIME TO STUDY COMIC BOOK MONEY MAKING

- Start your attack earlier than you think necessary- Now is the best time to accomplish anything because you are mentally ready.
- Set aside specific times to learn each day.
- Try to spread your learning throughout the week.
- Give yourself at least 1-3 days off per week and don't think about it at all during those days.
- Try to reduce time spent on other things while studying because you can do them as soon as you finish and it will only slow you down to distract yourself. Distraction is a choice.

If you find yourself not putting in the time, rather than losing out on all the benefits, reduce the amount of time each day you planned and do the new time instead to get the ball rolling for making money with comics. Being busy is an excuse. Luck is an uncontrollable factor; That being said, optimize every other thing you CAN control. Most don't which is why new guys like you & me have the ability to get in.

GETTING STARTED 7 "DO'S"

1. Do create multiple options for every major system you create" Knowledge is power and this will lead to a sustainable organization regardless of outside conditions that you have little control over..
2. Do ask lots of questions to those who appear successful with it without prying-There is a clear line.
3. Do something on the comic book money making path of success every single day even if you have a cold whether it is testing techniques for pressing, working on books, watching the course, talking to a friend, or improving your set up, thinking outside the box, applying old strategies that have failed before, taking what successful people do testing every element and creating your own version
4. Do find a small space you can use that won't be disturbed-I converted my old closet! Do think about getting \$100 industrial shelves in your bedroom or office. Most people think many things are not possible. Do it better than them and do it now.
5. Do make sure to reuse supplies (when possible) to keep costs down. Find easy ways to keep your cost down. Do eliminate spaces such as storage if possible that are not frequently being used and suck profit away like a vampire. Do try to make money.
6. Do keep a notebook to track your progress. (not a shared notebook unless you have the discipline to keep them separate from you and not get distracted.) Distraction essentially comes from within. The comic book does not choose itself to get pressed or not-You choose. It is also your choice if you want to succeed or fail. Do keep a separate notebook for pressing, buying/selling, and or investing so you can keep your revenue streams separate and not bury profit accidentally.
7. Do take pictures of before and after of your work, and keep a logbook so you can easily track your progress. Including financial goals is a very overlooked

GETTING STARTED 7 "DON'TS"

1. Don't use any free or literature based method (such as free how tos on the internet or random books found in stores) without repeatedly testing it on CHEAP different paper types and consulting multiple professionals for their opinions as well. For
2. Don't be discouraged by Joe Greasy Schmo Presser Guy who presses comic books for the lazy owner of your local comic shop who tells you how difficult it is or that it is "just like baking cookies but more like pancakes." Don't be discouraged by lazy shop owners who insist this biz is impossible. If it is impossible for them, they are not doing it right. Don't believe everything you hear. Don't give up or you will definitely fail.
3. Don't press first thing when you wake up unless you expect to go to your comic book's funeral.
4. Don't practice on any comic book that is worth more than a few dollars-You will regret it later. Don't make financial decisions when you are not thinking clearly. This includes any type of conflict.
5. Don't stop your income stream from coming in while learning the art of pressing, buying/selling, and or investing.
6. Don't overdo it to get that little spot in a corner if it does not affect grade because risk of damage is high. It's not worth it, you know it, I know it and our OCDs know it-Seriously just don't do it. Similarly don't milk every single last penny whether buying/sell or investing=Keeping your money turning is important.
7. Don't get too stressed - try meditation, yoga, or taking deep breaths. If those don't work or you hate being quiet for ten minutes: Yell at the top of your lungs "I can do it." Firstly, you'll become super motivated, and secondly, nobody will mess with you. Yeah you're crazy but with that mindset you're gonna be crazy good. Don't let us down, you're gonna be awesome.
